

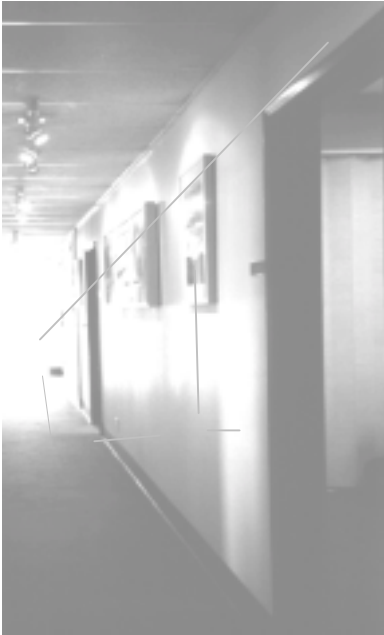

History

Northwest Aviation College was founded in 1992; resulting from the cumulative efforts of the principals and directors of Auburn Flight Service, Inc., who had long recognized a growing need for an accredited aviation degree granting institution in Western Washington. Although short in history, the success of Northwest Aviation College has been supported through its close relationship with Auburn Flight Service, Inc., which is recognized as a provider of quality aviation education since 1969.

Mission

The Mission of Northwest Aviation College is to provide quality aviation educational services, with an emphasis on student success and a vision toward the future.

Vision

The Vision of Northwest Aviation College is to identify, analyze, develop and implement, value-added systems, solutions and services.



Northwest Aviation College is located at the Auburn Municipal Airport, 506 23rd St., NE, Auburn WA 98002. The general telephone number is (253)-854-4960. Auburn Municipal Airport is located 30 miles southeast of Seattle. The airport incorporates a 3,400 foot paved runway with runway lighting, runway end identifier lighting, and visual approach slope indicators.

Northwest Aviation College operates a 2,700 square foot administration and classroom building at the Auburn municipal airport. The College receives administrative support from Auburn Flight Service, Inc. and aircraft fleet-support from the Auburn Flight Services.

All training rooms are well lighted and the temperature is thermostatically controlled. Each room is well ventilated and conforms to all local building, sanitation, and health codes.
